Excellence of ṣalāt upon the Prophet

صَلُّوا عَلَى الْحَبِيبِ صَلَّى اللَّهُ عَلَى مُحَمَّدٍ

The Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah, 'Allāmah Muhammad Ilyas Attar Qadiri Razawi رَحِمَهُ اللهُ الْعَالِيَهُ is a great scholarly and spiritual figure of the present era. He hails from the personalities whom Allah has honoured with knowledge and wisdom of staggering proportion. His words and statements cause listeners to become embodiments of good character, who then go on to secure a treasure of blessings in this world and the Hereafter.

Let us attempt to decorate our inner and outward states by reading his words of wisdom.

Statements from the Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah

1. Safeguarding other Muslims from one's own evil is an action from amongst those that can take one to Paradise.¹
2. The biggest quality of a person is being faithful (being Muslim).²
3. Build the habit of performing good deeds sincerely whilst avoiding ostentation. If a sincere person does

good whilst hiding behind 1000 veils, Allah Almighty will ordain for him to be renowned amongst people.¹

4. The future (referring to the grave and Hereafter) of those who acquire Islamic knowledge is radiantly bright.²
5. Smiling is sunnah. People draw close to those who smile, and they run from those who always exhibit sour faces.³
6. May it not be so that you utter words of humility whilst attempting to show off. Do not refer to yourself as lowly or a *faqīr* unless you truly feel this way in your heart.⁴
7. He who adopts the company of a practising Sunni scholar with correct beliefs will go on to attain both knowledge and spirituality.⁵
8. Only devotees of the blessed Prophet have this characteristic: when they go to Madinah, they shed tears as they consider themselves unworthy of visiting. As they return, they shed tears yet again as they are to be separated from Madinah.⁶

9. Remember! The world has never come to help anyone and nor will it, nether shall it accompany you into the grave.¹
10. True freedom is in becoming servants of the final Prophet ﷺ, the honourable Companions, the purified *Ahl al-Bayt* and *Awliya* رضوان الله عليهم أجمعين.²
11. On occasions of happiness, such as weddings or birthdays etc., it is more useful to give money as opposed to a particular gift. In this manner, the receivers may tend to their needs with it.³
12. It is necessary to abstain from anything which opens the door to sin.⁴
13. Acceptance is not founded on abundance or scarcity, but on sincerity.⁵
14. Imams and muezzins in masjids are both usually from the middle class and given small salaries. Everyone should try to support them financially as per one's own ability. Their hearts will be pleased by this **إِنْ شَاءَ اللَّهُ**. (Rather than giving them beautifully arranged packets containing prayer mats, boxes of sweets or perfume etc.,

try to give them physical money instead. This way, they can arrange medicine, food and clothing etc., for themselves)¹

15. When placing badges which depict the blessed sandal of the Prophet ﷺ upon one's *imāmah* or clothing, the goal is to acquire blessings, not decoration.²
16. It is sunnah to apply oil to the eyebrows. Headaches are relieved by this.³
17. When seeking to acquire even worldly goodness, we must only do that which is in complete accordance with shari'ah.⁴
18. Those who wish to support me financially should instead support their local Sunni scholar who holds correct beliefs.⁵
19. One form of remaining patient upon a calamity is to not reveal it to anyone without reason.⁶

20. Whenever you speak, only speak good. Pleasant words contain such magic that they cause the disobedient and rebellious to become obedient.¹
21. Milk is a bounty from Allah which both hydrates and nourishes. The best milk is from sheep, and this digests quickly.²
22. Bathing in warm water is a way to remove tiredness, as well as reciting *tasbīḥ-i-Fāṭimah* (سُبْحَنَ اللّٰهِ 33 times, اَللّٰهُمَّ صَلِّ عَلَى النَّبِيِّ 33 times, and اَللّٰهُمَّ اَكْبِر 34 times) before sleeping.³
23. Value your parents, as there is no replacement for them.⁴
24. Parents should teach their children with love and wisdom. Telling them off, hitting them or shouting at them for everything will lead to them disobeying you.⁵
25. Righteous children do not raise their voice when speaking to their parents. They instead show utmost decorum and kiss their hands and feet.⁶

26. A matter which cannot be kept between two lips is not able to be kept elsewhere (how can we hope for another person to keep our secret if we do not keep it ourselves?).¹
27. When there is a positive assumption that a particular person's du'ā is accepted, they should be asked to pray for one's forgiveness without accountability.²
28. There is no bad in having a good opinion and no good in harbouring a bad assumption.³
29. Drink 12 glasses of water every day, otherwise amounting to around 3 litres. **إِنْ شَاءَ اللَّهُ** You shall avoid kidney-related issues and constipation.⁴
30. If Muslims were to stop expenditure upon outward exhibition and instead live in moderation, the advent of prosperity shall occur **إِنْ شَاءَ اللَّهُ**.⁵
31. Time is a bounty, and a bounty is valued once it is lost. Spend your time in good deeds and make your time valuable.⁶

32. The most respectable and intelligent group in society are scholars. Do not criticise or find faults in them, but respect them instead.¹
33. Muslims now disgrace one another through social and printed media. This is despite the fact Islam has made Muslims protectors of one another's honour.²
34. An individual with great amounts of money is considered rich. In reality, a rich person is he who is content with how much Allah has given to him.³
35. One should visit the shrines/resting places of pious elders in order to acquire blessings and walk in their footsteps (in order to acquire goodness in this world and the Hereafter).⁴
36. Reading *Das Bibiyoun ki Kahāni*, *Sayyidah ki Kahāni* and other unfounded stories, as well as taking oaths related to them, are all impermissible. If someone made a vow to read them, it is impermissible to act upon such a vow.⁵

37. Telling someone your secret is equivalent to becoming their servant.¹
38. Some think it is necessary for a person to only open their fast with dates, water or salt. This is not the case. One may open their fast with any food or drink.²
39. Without doubt, public rectification can be done wherever needed. Some ignorant people, however, reveal the shortcomings of a Muslim to thousands upon thousands on social media and call this 'rectification'. Through this, the respect of a Muslim is violated.³
40. If you wish to draw close to the Messenger of Allah ﷺ, obey him, studiously act upon his sunnah and recite *ṣalāt* upon him in abundance. *إِنْ شَاءَ اللَّهُ* With the blessings of this, you shall draw close to him.⁴
41. Islam denounces trouble and mischief. It encourages love, peace and brotherhood.⁵
42. It is natural for children to copy their elders. If salah is offered at home, the children shall naturally copy this

and offer salah themselves. If (مَعَاذَ اللَّهِ) music and dancing occur at home, the child will go on to emulate this instead.¹

43. In order to be steadfast in performing good deeds, one must initially force the *nafs* towards them.²
44. One must act upon all national laws that do not conflict with shari‘ah.³
45. If (Allah forbid) sin-filled television channels are shown at home, children will grow up to sing songs and perform film dialogue. If Madani Channel is shown, then رَحِمَهُمُ اللَّهُ children will have their faith safeguarded and their character developed beautifully. They shall also recite dhikr and *ṣalāt* upon the Prophet.⁴
46. Committing a sin is one thing; one should not even go close to it in the first place.⁵
47. Focus on quality, not quantity.

48. Adopt silence, piety and goodness. Rather than a debater, become a *muballigh*. **إِنْ شَاءَ اللَّهُ** People shall follow you.¹
49. Due to my repute, I fear the hidden plan of Allah countless times over.²
50. Be serious, but not to the extent one is stern-faced when he should smile.³
51. Smiling solves many problems.⁴
52. The oppressed always prevail (in relation to the Hereafter).⁵
53. He who recites the Quran with correct rules and regulations is worthy of being envied.⁶
54. Feed children milk, fruit and vegetables instead of confectionery etc. **إِنْ شَاءَ اللَّهُ** Children will remain healthy.⁷

55. The character of a Muslim should comprise no element of ill-behaviour.¹
56. **اَلْحَمْدُ لِلّٰهِ** I frequently pray for my spiritual disciples (*murīd*) and aspirants (*ṭālib*).²
57. Friends during times of ease are plentiful, but not many are found in times of difficulty.³
58. During the month of Muḥarram, authentic excellences of the *Ahl al-Bayt* (عَلَيْهِمُ الرِّضْوَان) should be explained in speeches so that the sanctity of these blessed individuals can be firmly entrenched in the hearts of people. (Advice for *muballighs*)⁴
59. True honour is that of the Hereafter. Worldly honour is no standard of measure.⁵
60. What you desire is not acquired by ‘wanting’, but by ‘doing’. ‘Doing’ contains blessings.⁶

61. Avoid negligent people to save yourself from negligence.¹
62. Hearts are not won by the sword, but by good character.²
63. Instead of applying 'spice' to a wound, apply 'ointment'.³
64. He who advises us has favoured us.⁴
65. Whoever acquires enthusiasm (to practically carry out actions) will not leave the sunnah, no matter what corner of the world he goes to.⁵
66. Instead of considering your humble home inferior when seeing another person's mansion, look at those who reside on the footpath with no home to call their own.⁶
67. Realisation is the foundation of love.⁷

68. Broken hearts should be mended and not the other way around.¹
69. It is sunnah to visit the unwell, but do not stay for a length of time which becomes a concern for them.²
70. A Muslim is rewarded for every difficulty. Patience is the treasure of Paradise.³
71. He who recites **يَا مُهَيِّمُ** 29 times a day will remain safe from all calamities and evils **إِنْ شَاءَ اللَّهُ**.⁴
72. One accepted good deed is better than all the wealth and kingship of this world.⁵
73. He who recites **يَا اللَّهُ** 100 times when sleeping will remain safe from the mischief of evil jinn. He will also be protected from paralysis and Bell's palsy **إِنْ شَاءَ اللَّهُ**.⁶
74. It is a sign of good fortune to be happy when the month of Ramaḍān arrives and to be sad when it departs.⁷

75. Eid is not confined to wearing colourful clothing, leisure and eating good food. It is a day to thank Allah, do that which pleases Him and inquire about the health of those around us.¹
76. Misfortunate is he who has nobody to advise him.²
77. Sins should not be committed, nor should one abandon crying (over sins one has committed).³
78. The bigger person is he who tolerates criticism.⁴
79. Students are the wealth of a country. They are capable of changing its destiny.⁵
80. The acceptance (of good deeds) is not based upon abundance or scarcity, but on sincerity.⁶
81. Never speak in a boasting manner.⁷
82. Give respect to acquire it.⁸

83. Show love to children, elderly and the unwell.¹
84. When seeing our conduct, people should say, “He should be followed.”²
85. Seriousness is the adornment of a scholar.³
86. The dhikr of Allah is food for the soul.⁴
87. Can we be happy after doing something which displeases Allah? (Definitely not).⁵
88. Seek counsel from those who fear Allah and are honest.⁶
89. I love the offspring of the Prophet ﷺ due to their link with him.⁷
90. We will attain entry into Paradise for the sake of the Prophet’s ﷺ offspring.⁸
91. The true occasion for happiness is when one visits Madinah.⁹

92. Focus should be on collecting good deeds in Ramaḍān rather than acquiring money.¹
93. When I come to know so-and-so is doing religious work for Dawat-e-Islami, my heart becomes elated.²
94. The most inspiring person is he who avoids sin and takes every step in accordance with the sunnah.³
95. The biggest way to win the hearts of people is to keep a smile upon your face. However, smile whilst intending to act upon the sunnah. Draw people close to you in order to call them to righteousness.⁴
96. Although it is tremendous to save someone's life, it is far greater to save their faith.⁵
97. If good company is not unique; it is though rare.⁶
98. Eid al-Fitr is not for those who missed their fasts, but for those who fasted.⁷

99. According to me, the best day for me is that in which no sin occurred.¹
100. The best way to have someone adhere to principles is to act upon them yourself.²
101. Rather than decorating your being, seek to decorate your book of deeds.³
102. The greatest position to be in is to be a servant of the Prophet ﷺ.⁴
103. Things are done by 'doing', not simply desiring or worrying.⁵
104. Worldly happiness is temporary and has much sadness concealed within it.⁶
105. Seeking to utilise complex words during a speech and seeking praise from others is a woodworm that eats into the reward of said speech.⁷

106. Collect good deeds by selling your items to Muslims for a cheaper price in Ramaḍān. This month is a time to collect said good deeds as opposed to wealth.¹
107. People who dive into danger without appropriate guidance from shari‘ah are not brave, but rather foolish.²
108. A good friend is he who reminds you of Allah when you see him.³
109. Whether ill or in debt, no change must come in one’s mood (meaning, one’s conduct and behaviour must not be negatively affected).⁴
110. Devoted followers are found once a person goes through sacrifices himself.⁵
111. Instead of striving to become a person of wealth, become a person of good deeds.⁶
112. We are humble servants of Allah, and we are to solely be humble, rather than wicked.⁷

113. We should remain away from whoever says sharī‘ah and spirituality are separate entities.¹
114. The dominion we acquire through being servants of the Prophet ﷺ is not established over the being of others, but over their hearts.²
115. Attend the weekly itjimā‘ punctually. **إِنْ شَاءَ اللَّهُ** You shall also become punctual in offering salah with congregation.³
116. If we attain the position of being servants of the Messenger ﷺ, there is no need for any other position (meaning, no need for any worldly position of power).⁴
117. The 72 Pious Deeds booklet is a way to remember Allah, and only through remembering Him do hearts find peace.⁵
118. In order to acquire the wealth of love, read stories and incidents which relate to the love of Allah and His Messenger ﷺ.⁶

119. Whoever is harmed or encounters difficulty in their religious matters should remember the Messenger of Allah ﷺ.¹
120. If you acquire knowledge of *munjiyāt* (deeds that lead to salvation) and *muhlikāt* (deeds that place one in ruin), then you can stand in opposition to Satan to a great extent.²
121. It is incumbent upon one's intellect to give thanks for its cognitive ability, as this is a gift from Allah.³
122. If one has passion, there are a thousand paths. If one has no passion, there are a thousand excuses.⁴
123. If possible, acquire the best animal possible for one's *qurbani* and present said *qurbani* in the court of the Prophet ﷺ.⁵
124. The competence of a teacher is measured through if he can take struggling students, teach them, and ultimately make them successful in their exams.⁶
