
May Allah bless us with the opportunity to visit Makkah and Madinah again and again.

Du'ā of the Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah's successor

O Allah! Whosoever reads or listens to the 24-page booklet *The Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah's 'umrah and visit to Madinah (2022)*, allow them to visit the *Ḥaramayn*! Allow them to see the Ka'bah and city of Madinah time and time again, and forgive them without accountability!

The excellence of reciting *salāt* upon the Prophet

The leading hadith scholar, Shaykh 'Abd al-Ḥaqq Dihlawi محمَّهُ اللَّهِ عَلَيْهِ said:

Whenever my murshid, Shaykh ʿAbd al-Wahhāb Muttaqi بمختهُ اللّهِ , would depart from Madinah, he who would say, 'During the ḥajj journey, there is no greater duʿā after the obligatory than *ṣalāt* upon the Prophet

صَلَّى اللَّهُ عَلَيْهِ وَالْهِ وَسَلَّمَ. Spend all your time in this, and dye yourself in the colour of salāt.'1



The virtue of 'umrah

O devotees of the Messenger! 'Umrah is a distinguished act of worship and a sunnah of Allah's Messenger صَلَّ اللَّهُ عَلَيْهِ وَالْهِ وَسَلَّهُ , who in his blessed observable lifetime, performed it four times alongside one ḥajj. ² The literal meaning of 'umrah is visiting/beholding. Its definition according to sharī'ah is "visiting the House of Allah whilst adhering to specified conditions."³

What can be said regarding the virtues of this auspicious deed! A hadith in Ṣaḥīḥ Bukhāri explains, "One 'umrah to another is expiation for the sins between them."

Mufti Aḥmad Yār Khān ﴿ تَحْمُقُاللّٰهِ عَلَيْهُ writes in commentary of this hadith, "The scholars mention the minor sins committed between two 'umrahs are forgiven." 5

Let us now move onto discussing the Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah's 'umrah journey.

The leader of Ahl al-Sunnah's journey from Dubai to Jeddah

The Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah set off on his journey to Madinah from his place of stay in the U.A.E. He initially headed to Jeddah with the Central Executive Committee Head Haji Muhammad Imran Attari, Haji Ali Raza¹ and the latter's son Hasan Raza. The Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah's son, al-Haj Ubayd Raza Attari Madani متطلّفات , had already arrived in Arabia with his honourable mother and family. On the 20th of Rabī 'al-Ākhir 1444 AH (Tuesday 15th of November 2022), the Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah then began his journey to Makkah to perform 'umrah.

Performing 'umrah in advanced age

The leader of Ahl al-Sunnah والمشابرة was born on the 26th of Ramaḍān 1369 AH (Wednesday 12th July 1950). In accordance with the *hijri* calendar, he is around 74 years of age. The weakness and frailty generally found in people of this age is commonly understood; even a seemingly easy task like wuḍū can become difficult, and for a person of this age to get by without the support of a walking stick is a great bounty.

A poet beautifully said:

Dast o pā gosh o zabān hosh mein hain Karnā hai jo kar le āj hi

Meaning: One's hands and body begin to tremble with weakness in old age, along with the tongue beginning to stumble in speech and hearing faculties diminishing. Whilst one has their hands, ears and entire body in their control during their youth, they should utilise this in performing good deeds.

Worship in your youth

Take advantage of the bounty of youth by spending your time worshipping and obeying Allah. Intending to worship only in old age is wishful thinking and a futile thought process. Even if one reaches old age, their hands, feet, ears, eyes and other body parts will not function as they did due to death being closer than ever. It becomes difficult to even offer salah whilst standing, never mind other acts of worship. The Reviver of Islam and Imam of Ahl al-Sunnah, Imam Aḥmad Razā Khān خَمُةُ اللّٰهِ عَلَيْكُ said:

Utarte chānd dhaltī chāndni jo ho sake kar le Andherā pākh āta hai ye dō din kī ujālī hai¹

Explanation of this couplet: O young person! Value your youth and worship as much as possible, for death wishes to come and

you shall soon find yourself in the dark night of the grave. The light of life lasts for but a few days; it comes to an end swiftly.

The desire of Attar

Dear Islamic brothers! Think this over carefully: on one hand is 'umrah and fulfilling all the actions that comprise it, and on the other is a 74-year-old elder of advanced age and delicate frame. The Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah had never used a wheelchair to perform *ṭawāf* (circumambulation) of the Kaʿbah, and his heart did not desire for this. Instead, he yearned for the joy of making *ṭawāf* of the Kaʿbah on his own two feet.

He drank Zamzam water and made duʿā a handful of times for the fulfilment of this heartfelt wish; once when departing from Jeddah to Makkah, and a second time in Masjid al-Ḥarām before ṭawāf itself.

Allah showered such mercy upon His righteous servant, that the Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah did not require a wheelchair to complete both his *ṭawāf* and *sa ʿī*. In fact, he was blessed to the extent he was able to perform these rites with the same wuḍū. In gratitude for this bounty, his heart and body fell into prostration thereafter.¹

Visiting Masjid al-Ḥarām and the Kaʿbah

After arriving at their hotel in Makkah and resting for a short time, they left for Masjid al-Ḥarām. When the Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah stepped into the masjid with his right foot, he recited عَرَيْتُ سُنَّتَ الْإِمْتِكَافِ aloud, perhaps to remind those around him to do the same.

The group advanced towards the Ka'bah, and as they reached the area in which *ṭawāf* is conducted, they found an aweinspiring sight before them. The Ka'bah was now directly in front of them, and its beauty clearly visible without any

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and supplicate, "O Allah! obstruction. Eyes brimful with tears, they raised their hands and began a series of du as and pleas in the court of Allah.

Tawāf of the Ka'bah and istilām of the Black Stone

If possible, place both palms on the Black Stone and kiss it by placing your mouth between your palms, doing so without producing a sound. If it is not possible to do this due to a crowd, then do not cause harm to others nor force yourself into the crowd. Rather you should point towards it with your hands and then kiss your hands. Maqām Ibrāhīm

After performing seven rounds of *ṭawāf*, it is *wājib* for the one performing 'umrah to offer two units of salah near Maqām Ibrāhīm if there is space; otherwise, he may offer it anywhere he finds space within Masjid al-Ḥarām provided it is not a *makrūh* time. Having offered the salah of *ṭawāf*, the Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah read a particular du'ā near Maqām Ibrāhīm. (This du'ā is mentioned on page 63 of *Rafīq al-Mu'tamirīn*.)

At Multazam

It is sunnah to go to the *Multazam*² after offering the salah of *ṭawāf*. Explaining the method of presenting oneself thereupon, the Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah said to those performing 'umrah in his company:

We must present ourselves in direct line with the *Multazam*. As the door and cover of the Ka'bah are

profusely perfumed and someone in the state of *iḥrām* must avoid perfume, refrain from coming into contact with it.

The Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah remained here for as long as Allah willed and made duʿā in his heart with utmost humility. He made duʿā again after drinking Zamzam and then set off for Ṣafā and Marwah to perform *saʿī*.

Sa'ī and ḥalq

It is liked (*mustaḥab*) to offer two units of salah after performing the seven circuits of *sa* 'ī.¹After offering this salah, the Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah exited Masjid al-Ḥarām. As he headed back to his hotel, he passed by the sanctified place in which the final Prophet of Allah مَنَّ اللَّهُ عَلَيْهِ وَالْهِ وَسَالَعُ was born. Burgeoning with love and devotion, he raised his hands in its direction and kissed them. Arriving back at his hotel, an Islamic brother was already waiting to carry out *ḥalq* for him. The Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah then mentioned some Madani pearls of wisdom regarding this and had *ḥalq* performed, thus completing his 'umrah 'Indaha' 'umrah' 'Indaha' 'Indah

Expiation for every wudū

Dear Islamic brothers! It is incumbent upon someone in the state of *iḥrām* to learn necessary rulings pertaining to it. The Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah gives *ṣadaqah al-fiṭr* in the way of Allah as a precautionary measure whenever performing wuḍū in the

state of *iḥrām* during ḥajj or 'umrah. This serves as an expiation for any hairs that fall from the head or beard whilst performing wuḍū.

During this 'umrah, he performed wuḍū a total of three times, and gave three lots of ṣadaqah al-fiṭr for them. (To learn necessary rulings regarding ḥajj or 'umrah, read the Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah's books Rafīq al-Ḥaramayn and Rafīq al-Mu'tamirīn. A night in Makkah

O devotees of the Messenger! Makkah is an ancient city of great distinction. Allah has also mentioned it in the Quran. The observable blessed lifetime of the final Prophet صَلَّى اللَّهُ عَلَيْهِ وَاللّهِ وَسَلَّمَ was 63 years long, 53 of which he spent in this renowned city.

After his 'umrah, the Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah spent that day and the forthcoming night in Makkah. He was set to depart for Madinah at 8am the next day via train.

Having dinner late at night, he then went into the streets of Makkah, walking for a short while in order to take in its blessings. Even during this time, he maintained his well-wishing and sympathy for others. In order to bring happiness to other Islamic brothers, he sent them video and audio messages conveying Madani pearls of knowledge and making duʿā for them. An Islamic brother from Karachi (Pakistan) was due to

undergo an operation, and the Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah expressed his support for him in the following way:

It is around 4:30am and I am walking through the streets of Makkah. I have had the honour of performing 'umrah.

May Allah grant you cure through the blessings of Makkah, and may your operation be successful without any side effects. Stay hopeful. Things will improve النُصَاءَ اللهُ.

Decorum for Madinah

O devotees of the Messenger! The etiquette of visiting the sanctified resting place of Allah's Messenger صَلَّى اللَّهُ عَلَيْتِ وَاللهِ وَسَلَّمَ has been mentioned in the Quran. The Reviver of Islam and Imam of Ahl al-Sunnah, Imam Aḥmad Razā Khān رَحْمَتُهُ اللَّهِ عَلَيْهِ writes:

Amir al-Mu'minīn 'Umar مَثِى اللَّهُ عَنْهُ once came across a person raising their voice before the resting place of the Prophet صَلَّى اللَّهُ عَلَيْهِ وَاللهِ وَسَلَّمَ He said, "Do you raise your voice above the Prophet's voice?" He then recited this verse:

يَّأَيُّهَا الَّذِينَ أَمَ نُوْالَا تَرْفَعُوَّا أَصْوَاتَكُمْ فَوْقَ صَوْتِ النَّبِيّ

Translation from Kanz al-Īmān: O believers! Do not raise your voices higher than the voice of this Conveyor of the unseen (i.e. the Beloved Prophet Muhammad)¹

Adab gāhe sat zeir-i-āsmān az ʿArsh nāzuk tar Nafas gam kardah mī āyad Junayd o Bāyazīd ēn jā

Meaning: There is an august and grand court beneath the heavens whose protocol is more sensitive than the 'Arsh, where great saints like Junayd Baghdādi and Bāyazīd Bisṭāmi ومُحَمَّةُ اللّهِ عَلَيْهِمَا dare not even breathe loudly.

Dear Islamic brothers! If we were to mention accounts detailing the Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah's respect and etiquette for Madinah, it would become an entire book. There were also some children² present in his group. Before the journey began, he advised them regarding the etiquette of visiting Madinah, which has been presented below with minor amendments.

This contains a lesson particularly for parents who take their young children with them that do not yet have an understanding of Masjid al-Ḥarām, Madinah al-Munawwarah, Masjid al-

Nabawi and other sacred sites. Before taking your children to these blessed places, be sure to inform them of the required etiquette so that the honour and esteem of these holy places become rooted within their hearts from a young age.

The Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah's advice to the children travelling with him

Dear children! We are about to begin our journey to Madinah. Once we sit in the train, observe *qufl-e-Madinah*. This means we must not speak unnecessarily, joke around, laugh, etc. If you have something important to say, kindly speak with your father. We must not keep asking questions like, "Where are we now?" or "How long will it take?" This is because the journey to Madinah is only full of joy. Recite *n'at*, send *ṣalāt* upon the Prophet عَلَّ اللَّهُ عَلَيْعِوَالْهِ وَسَالًا and make dhikr of Allah.

When in Madinah, we must not put things down with force. We should place them gently so that no sound is produced. If we can cry in love of the Prophet صَلَّى اللّهُ عَلَيْهِ وَالْهِ وَسَلَّمَ, then by Allah! This is an immense bounty.

May Allah grant us true decorum for the city of Madinah. May He grant us martyrdom in the cool shade of the Green Dome, whilst beholding His beloved and reciting the *kalimah*. May He allow us to be buried in Jannat al-Baqī'.



The journey to Madinah begins

The journey from Makkah to Madinah then commenced. This journey of around two and a half hours became enveloped in a passionate, emotional atmosphere of n 'at poetry, and the train arrived in seemingly no time. Everyone stood out of love and began to present their salaam in the Prophetic court. An Arab man was observing this from a distance and recorded this beautiful scene on his phone. First visitation to the Prophetic court

The group slowly made their way towards Masjid al-Nabawi. As they neared the masjid, the Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah's successor Haji Ubayd Raza Attari مَتَطِلُهُ العَالِي recited a couplet describing how the Prophet صَلَّى اللَّهُ عَلَيْهِ وَالْهِ وَسَلَّم means everything to them.

This caused tears to begin flowing. The *mi 'rāj* of Madinah's devotee had arrived, and before him was the beautiful Green Dome atop the resting place of Allah's Messenger صَلَّى اللَّهُ عَلَيْوِدَالْهِ وَسَلَّم. As soon as his eyes fell upon this, the Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah began to present salaam in the following words:

As he wept, he would go between reciting ṣalāt upon the Prophet صَلَّى اللهُ عَلَيْهِ وَاللَّهِ وَسَلَّةُ and humbly asking for intercession:

"O Messenger of Allah صَلَّى اللَّهُ عَلَيْهِ وَاللهِ وَسَلَّمَ, I ask you for your intercession."

He continued to stand and respectfully present his salaam like this from a distance for some time. Haji Ubayd Raza Attari continued reciting poetry, stoking the flame of love ever higher. The Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah then returned to his car whilst walking backwards, for if turning one's back to the Ka'bah is against proper etiquette, how can one turn their back to the Ka'bah's Ka'bah?

Visiting the shrine of Sayyidunā Ḥamza

After visiting the Prophetic court, the Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah visited the shrine of the leading martyr *Sayyidunā* Ḥamza and other martyrs of Uhud عَلَيْهِمُ الرِّفْتُونَاتُ. Their shrines are located in close proximity to Mount Uḥud. The Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah performed *fātiḥah* thereupon, and then met the devotees of the Messenger who were present.

Visiting Masjid al-Nabawi

The next morning, the Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah presented himself in Masjid al-Nabawi. Taking care to walk gently, he recited couplets penned by Imam Aḥmad Razā Khān مِثَمُّةُ اللَّهِ عَلَيْهِ, and others written by the latter's brother, *Mawlānā* Ḥasan Razā Khān مِنْحَةُ اللَّهِ عَلَيْهِ.

He then offered ṣalāt al-ḍuḥā in a place from which the Green Dome was clearly visible. آلتَتُ These are the priceless moments of life and times of joy, with the mercy of Allah showering down. With passion and devotion, he presented ṣalāt and salaam in the Prophetic court for some time, and whenever his gaze would fall upon the Green Dome, he would lower his head and fold his hands respectfully. One can only wonder of the pleas that this true devotee made in the Prophetic court within his heart. On the return journey, the Amir of Ahl al-

Sunnah's successor recited couplets from a poem which asks the Messenger of Allah صَلَّى اللَّهُ عَلَيْهِ وَاللهِ وَسَلَّمَ for his mercy and grace.

Their hearts were already overwhelmed with love, and these couplets seeking aid from the Prophet صَلَّى اللهُ عَلَيْهِ وَاللهِ وَسَلَّمَ only intensified this. The Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah began to weep loudly and exclaimed:

Departing from Madinah

Mufti Aḥmad Yār Khān مُحْمَّةُ اللَّهِ عَلَيْه said:

Do not ask regarding the state of those leaving Madinah, as parting from this city is most painful. I have observed people clinging to the threshold of Masjid al-Nabawi and sobbing.¹

Final night in Madinah

After a brief stay of 36 hours in Madinah, the time to part had arrived. The Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah wrote the following words

Perhaps I will depart from Madinah around four and a half hours after writing this. (21st Rabī al-Ākhir 1444 AH - 17th November 2022)



The farewell visit

The night of bidding farewell to Madinah arrived. After presenting salaam in the Prophetic court, the group was set to leave the city of the beloved. In this day and age, if one wishes to see the state of a true devotee when leaving the court of the Prophet صَلَّى behold how the Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah did so. Those who watch these emotional scenes will be moved to tears themselves. In tears, the Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah exited his room and entered the lift, kissing the walls and doors as he passed.

He clung to the walls of the lift and began to cry intensely. In this state, he exited the lift and sat in the car. He continued to weep on the main road facing Jannat al-Baqīʿ as he gazed upon the Green Dome. After sending ṣalāt upon the Prophet, the time of departure finally arrived. He cried so intensely that those in his company were also unable to control their emotions. Then an Islamic brother went forward, took hold of him and seated him in the car.

As the car began moving away from Masjid al-Nabawi, the Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah gazed upon the dome and minarets of the masjid with tears in his eyes. He then suddenly exclaimed, "I can no longer see the dome!" Hearing this, those around him shed tears uncontrollably.

Tear-inducing words

In lament, longing and sadness, he then said:

Farewell, O Messenger of Allah! Farewell, O Messenger of Allah! We are leaving Madinah my master, please call us again and again! Bless us and do not leave us deprived of your intercession! Be pleased with us forever and ask your Lord to forgive us. O Messenger of Allah! May there be good for the entire *ummah*! For the sake of your princes, and for the sake of your Ahl al-Bayt and Companions, I request your intercession in particular for every member of Dawat-e-Islami. O Messenger of Allah, have mercy on us and grant us the blessings of your intercession!

From Madinah to Jeddah

The return journey from Madinah to Jeddah was via train. Listening to farewell poems for almost the entire time, the Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah was in a state of lament due to being separated

from Madinah. Expressing his anguish to a Madani Islamic brother, he wrote, "Madinah has become hidden from our sight. The train is pulling us ever further away. We will then arrive in Jeddah, and then..."

During his final moments in the blessed lands of Arabia, the Amir of Ahl al-Sunnah recited his own poetry and ultimately bade farewell.


