Ruling of Skipping Any Part of Al-Tahiyyat in The Last Qa'dah

Question

What do the noble scholars and jurists of Islamic law say about the following: If one forgets while reciting Al-Tahiyyat during the last qa'dah, what should they do?

Sitting in the last qa'dah of salah is fard i.e. sitting for the duration that one can recite the entire Al-Tahiyyat until عبدهورسوله. Without this, the fard will not be fulfilled. But reciting Al-Tahiyyat until عبدهورسوله in the first and last qa'dah is wajib. Mistakenly skipping the entire Al-Tahiyyat or any part of it will necessitate sajdah sahw and skipping it intentionally will cause the salah to become wajib al-i'adah.

While reciting Al-Tahiyyat in the last qa'dah, if one cannot remember further, he can repeat the Al-Tahiyyat he already recited. If he then recalls further, then he should complete it; otherwise, if he has forgotten and cannot recall the remaining part, he should recite the durood and dua, perform sajdah sahw, then complete his salah. This is because sitting for the duration it takes to recite Al-Tahiyyat was fard, which was completed, and Al-Tahiyyat, which was wajib, is substituted through the sajdah sahw. In this way, the salah will be valid. However, if one doesn't perform sajdah sahw, it will be wajib to repeat the salah.

Sitting in the last qa'dah for the duration of reciting Al-Tahiyyat is fard. Thus, it is stated in Al-Fatawa Al-'Alamgiri:

(Al-Fatawa Al-'Hindiyyah, Vol. 1, p. 70-71, Publ. Dar Al-Kutub Al-'Ilmiyah, Beirut) It is wajib to recite the entire Al-Tahiyyat, until عبدهورسوله, in the first and last qa'dah. It is stated in Al-Durr Al-Mukhtar Ma'a Radd Al-Muhtar:

(Al-Durr Al-Mukhtar Ma'a Radd Al-Muhtar, Vol. 2, Book of Salah, p. 196-197, Publ. Dar Al-Ma'rifah, Beirut)

Repeating the Tashahhud in the last qa'dah doesn't obligate sajdah sahw ever. It is stated in Al-Fatawa Al-'Alamgiri:

(Al-Fatawa Al-'Hindiyyah, Vol. 1, p. 127, Publ. Dar Al-Kutub Al-'Ilmiyah) Mistakenly skipping the entire Al-Tahiyyat or any part of it will obligate sajdah sahw. It is stated in Al-Bahr Al-Ra'ig:

يجب سجود السهوبتر كه ولوقليلا في ظاهر الرواية لأنه ذكروا حد منظوم فترك بعضه كترك كله ولا فرق بين القعدة الأولى أو الثانية

(Al-Bahr Al-Ra'iq, Vol. 2, p. 102-103, Publ. Dar Al-Kitab Al-Islami, Beirut) If one completely forgets Al-Tahiyyat and cannot recall it at all, sajdah sahw will substitute for it. Similarly, the one who forgets the wajib qira'at and performs ruku' out of compulsion, the ruling is that sajdah sahw will suffice. My master, A'la Hazrat Imam Ahmad Raza Khan عليه رحمة الرحمن states in Fatawa Razawiyyah:

جوفقط الحمد للله رب المحلمين پڑھ کر بھول گيا اور رکوع کر ديا نماز کا فرض ساقط ہوجا ئيگا مگرنا قص ہوئی کہ واجب ترک ہواالحمد ستریت مام و کمال پڑھنا ایک واجب ہے اور اس کے سواکسی دو سری سورت سے ایک آیت بڑی یا تین آیتیں چھوٹی پڑھنا واجب ہے ، اگر الحمد للله بھُولا تھا اور واجب اول کے اداکر نے سے بازر کھاگيا تو واجب دوم کے اداسے عاجز نہ تھا ، فقط ایک ہی آیت پر قنا عت کرکے رکوع کر دینے میں قصداً ترک واجب ہوا ، اور جو واجب قصداً چھوڑ اجائے سجدہ سہواس کی اصلاح نہیں کرستا تو واجب ہے کہ نماز دوبارہ پڑھے ، ہاں اگر ایسا بھُولا کہ نہ بقیہ فاتحہ یا د آتا ہے نہ قرآن عظیم سے کہیں کی آیتیں اور ناچارر کوع کر دیا اور سجد سے میں جانے کہا فاتحہ و آیات یا د نہ آئیں تو اب سجدہ سہوکا فی ہے۔

Translation: If one only recited الحمد لله رب العالمين and forgot further, then he went in ruku', the fard of salah is fulfilled, but it is insufficient because a wajib was not fulfilled. Reciting the complete Al-Fatihah is a separate wajib, and reciting one long verse or three short verses from another surah is also a wajib. If one forgot Al-Fatihah and didn't complete the first wajib, he was still able to complete the second wajib. Reciting only one verse and then going into ruku' is purposefully skipping a wajib; if a wajib is purposefully skipped, sajdah sahw cannot substitute for it. Therefore, it will be wajib to repeat the salah. However, if one completely forgot and is unable to remember the remaining Al-Fatihah or any part of the Qur'an, then he performed ruku' out of compulsion, performing sajdah sahw will suffice, given that he didn't recall Al-Fatihah or any verse until he performs sajdah. (Fatawa Razawiyyah, Vol. 6, p. 329-330, Publ. Raza Foundation, Lahore)

If one doesn't perform sajdah sahw despite it being necessary, it will become wajib to repeat the salah. Thus, it is stated in Al-Durr Al-Mukhtar:

تعادوجوبافي العمدوالسهوإن لميسجد

(Al-Durr Al-Mukhtar, Vol. 2, Chapter: Wajib acts in salah, p. 181, Publ. Dar Al-Ma'rifah, Beirut)

وَاللَّهُ اَعْلَمُ عَزَّوَجَلَّ وَرَسُولُه اَعْلَم صَلَّى اللَّهُ تَعَالَى عَلَيْهِ وَالِهِ وَسَلَّم (Allah Almighty knows best and His Messenger صَلَّى اللهُ عَلَيْهِ وَالِهِ وَسَلَّم knows best.)

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
